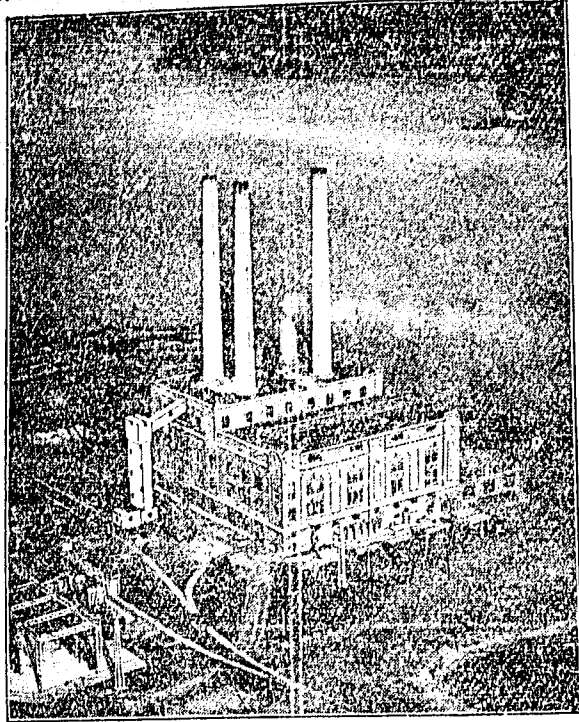

## C. L. & P. Co. Increases Power Capacity



Beginning tomorrow, a large part of Connecticut's area will have 25,000 additional kilowatts of electrical growth and to further assure an uninterrupted supply when at that time, the Connecticut Light and Power Company places in regular service an electric generating unit of the capacity stated following recent installation in the company's Montville Generating Station shown above.

Situated on the Thames river not far from the state's eastern boundary and overlooking the famous course where Harvard and Yale row annually their boating classic, Montville Station has at hand an abundance of water for cooling the steam after it has done its work and has excellent tide water facilities for receiving coal that is brought in by ocean steamer from Virginia mines.

Almost two years were spent in making in various factories the many pieces of machinery that comprise the unit and in installing them in the Montville Station to form what is really a complete and independent power plant. Addition of the new unit raises the electric producing capacity of Montville Station to 55,000 kilowatts. A feature of the unit are the two boilers, the size of a six-story business building. Other features are a steam turbine that develops sufficient horsepower to drive ten Diesel-powered high-speed trains across the country, an electric generator capable of supplying 10,000 homes, and transformers that step the electric pressure up to 70,000 volts, in order to transmit the electricity 40 miles to Meriden.
