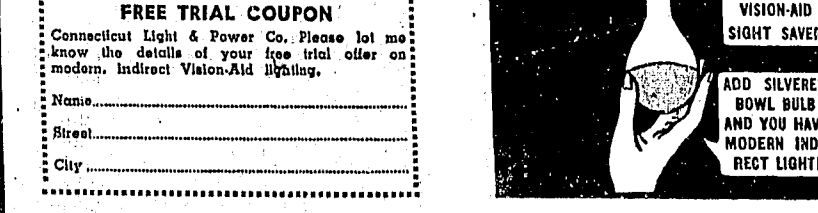

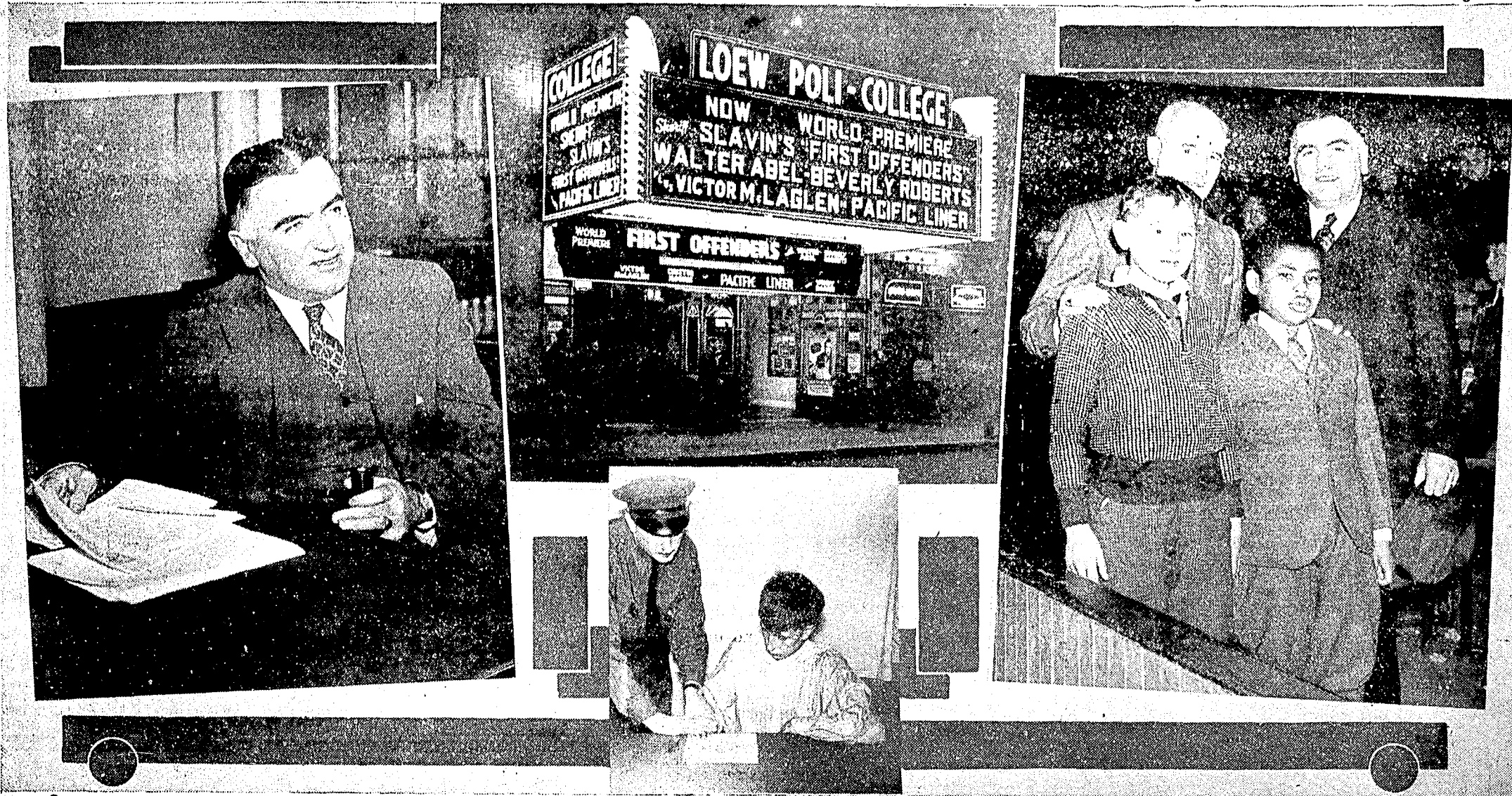

TWO BIG HOUSES

When I was a boy one of the wealthiest men in our part of the State lived in a big house on the hill.

We children spoke of that big house in awe-struck whispers because it represented untold wealth, unending dignity, a butler and servants, and we thought this man's family ate from gold plates and drank a special kind of nectar from the gods.

Sometimes we looked up at that house with envy. There were times when that envy was tinged with bitterness. Fortunately, there lived in our town a kindly old Irishman who took a keen interest in us boys long before there were any Boy Scouts, NYA or other group organizations.

That old gentleman had a kindly, homespun philosophy which I believe has continued to help many of us over the rough spots as we travel down the years. One of that group of boys is now a successful lawyer in one of our Connecticut cities. The other is a noted surgeon. There is no monument to that man in that little town, but I believe the careers of those he helped with his kindly advice have written a tribute in bigger letters than were ever carved in granite or marble. One night the old Irishman brought this wealthy old New England Yankee down to the fire house, and here's what he told us:

Boys, you are living under the greatest government in the world, where every boy no matter what his religion or the circumstances of his birth has unlimited opportunity.

A man is never poor until he loses his good character and reputation. I would say to you boys: Believe in your God, have a helping hand for your neighbor. Great nations are built in happy homes.

There's another big house on a hill: It is a prison. The men and women in this big house have not only strayed from their faith in God, but have lost faith in themselves.

If they had followed the simple rules laid down by the man in the other big house, they would have been an asset to their country rather than a liability as they now are.

Crime, according to J. Edgar Hoover, is costing this country 15 billions of dollars a year. That first police record may lead you into that second big house.

We are all people, fellow Americans, and we are all, every one of us fellow members of that great body of citizenry known as the American public, whether we live in a magnificent mansion on the crest of a hill-top or in a humble cottage on a neglected street, the other side of the railroad tracks.

THIS message is for you, each and every one of you reading this page.

CRIME knows no distinction of race, color, or condition in worldly goods—The threat of Crime is ever present—it may strike at any home—or it may breed in any home, even under the vigilant eye of the loving and ever watchful parent.

CRIME prevention is an age old problem. Attacking the evil after the Crime has occurred has been compared to locking the barn door after the horse has been stolen. Old offenders are difficult or impossible to reform, because they face a cold world, and have little experience except in criminal ways in which to make a living and thus become members of the Confirmed Criminal class.

We urge your cooperation with us, financially if you can, but morally at any rate, to spread the blessings of this movement into every community and into every home, lest, and we hope not, that otherwise continued neglect may cause this evil to knock at your door.
