### A HOSPITAL FOR THE AGED

The plan put forward by Representative Lamb of Plainville, House chairman of the Public Welfare and Humane Institutions of the State Legislature, that Grace Hospital in New Haven be acquired by the state as a hospital for the Chronically Ill, Aged and Infirm, is one worthy of the most earnest consideration. There is urgent need for such an institution in this part of Connecticut. Care for the aged and infirm has for too long been woefully neglected, and it is high time that something be done to better the conditions of those who have grown old and infirm in our communities.

Grace Hospital will be put to other uses upon the completion of the new Grace-New Haven Community Hospital, and we can think of no better purpose for this fine institution than that it be given over to making life easier for the too long neglected part of our population. Grace Hospital has a bed capacity of 230.

In the recent annual report of our own Welfare Department we note that while the number of relief cases has remained unchanged over last year there has been a substantial increase in the number of Old Age Assistance cases. A total of 261 applications for such assistance were filed in our Welfare Department alone. The number in the Greater New Haven area is very large. There are for instance some 250 or more old men and women in the New Haven Springside Home at the present time, a Municipal institution which cares not only for the indigent aged of that city but also takes in cases from East Haven and West Haven. Seventy-five of our East Haven old age assistance cases died last year and many of these required hospitalization or other medical and nursing care.

Should the plan put forward by Representative Lamb materialize aged and infirm men and women now quartered in private homes, but in need of hospitalization would be assigned to the transformed Grace Hospital. Poor Houses, and there are such still in Connecticut, have no place in a modern American society. The problem of dealing properly with the aged and the chronically ill is one that must be solved within the next few years.

### SCOUTING PROGRAM ENLARGED

With the reorganization of the District Committee of the Boy Scouts for the East Haven area under the chairmanship of Bart Gaffney and with Wesley W. Wright, Field Executive of Quinnipiac Council, assigned as secretary of the District committee, there are many indications of a further growth in the Scouting movement locally. The Boy Scouts have been active here for many years. Generations of boys have grown to better manhood under capable Scoutmasters. The program of scouting has been tried and tested with the years and merits the active and whole-hearted support of all who are interested in the welfare of youth.

The Scouting Committee is being reorganized, we understand, and new leaders are being recruited to fill the ranks, with the idea of broadening the activities and projects of Scouting in East Haven. For example, the committee proposes to enlist the services of several men of the town to serve as Merit Badge counselors and to be responsible for the general advancement of Scouts in this district. Others are to be chosen to take part in a Sustaining Membership Drive. There are also places to be filled in other sub-committees. Those approached to serve in these capacities should consider it, as it truly is, a public service to the community.

We also understand that more organizations and groups are to be approached with a view to establishing Sponsoring Institutions in order that the Scouting program can be made available to more and more East Haven boys.

Plans are also underway for a Camporee to be held in late May or early June and which could well serve as a rally to interest the people of this town in the Boy Scout movement. The recent paper salvage netted the boys \$50 which will be divided among the five units that participated. These funds will help to provide necessary scouting equipment. The boys are appreciative of the support by the townspeople in the recent salvage campaign.

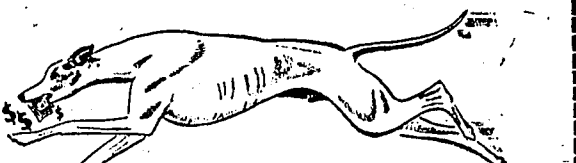
### T.E. Chancellor New Manager At Reo Plant Here

## Local Veteran On Cathedral Roll

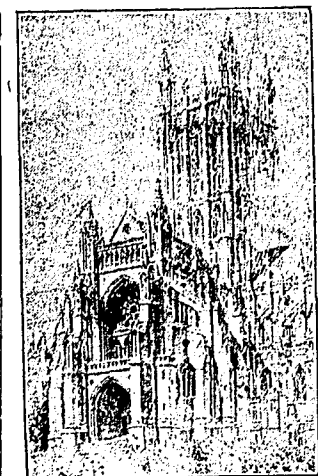
Former Sgt. Reinwald Is First East Havener to Have His Name Placed In Memorial Chapel.

The first East Haven veteran of World War II to be enrolled on the permanent National Roll of Honor at the unfinished Washington Cathedral in Washington D. C. is former Sergeant George Reinwald of 129 Kimberly Avenue. It was announced by the Rev. Merritt F. Williams, canon of the Cathedral and chairman of the national war memorial committee.

The East Haven veteran whose name is to be enshrined in the proposed War Memorial Chapel of the Patriots' Transept, southern arm of the cathedral upon which more than \$375,000 already has been expended for its foundations, served with the 932nd Field Artillery Battalion in the European theater. His name and war record were submitted to the National Roll of Honor by his father, George A. Reinwald of East Haven.

Canon Williams, associate chairman of the cathedral's national building fund campaign, a veteran of both World Wars and former chaplain of the war-lost aircraft carrier Wasp and the battleship West Virginia, stated:

"Names and service records of all service men and women of the recent and past wars are welcomed by the Cathedral War Memorial committee, and the privilege of memorializing the names and records of the war dead and of preserving those of the living, in thanksgiving for their safe return,

is open to all, "Canon Williams said. "The enrollment of names and records," he added, "is not contingent upon any consideration other than the expressed wish of families or next of kin."

The Patriots' Transept and five additional bays of the Cathedral nave are immediate objectives in a current nation-wide building fund campaign for five million

dollars. Cash and pledges of \$306,000 have already been obtained here prior to intensive solicitation elsewhere.

The War Memorial Chapel, according to plan will be ornamented by insignia of famous units of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard. When ready for use, the national roll of honor will be maintained here and preserve forever the names and records of all revered war dead and in commemoration of the war services of the living who returned safely.

Heroes of past wars and other distinguished military figures now buried here or commemorated in the Cathedral include: First world war President Woodrow Wilson; Admiral George Dewey; Lt. General Nelson A. Miles; Maj. General George Barnett, late Air Force corps commandant; Major General Hugh L. Scott; Admiral Gaspard de Coligny, French Huguenot martyr; Major Archibald Butt, military aide to presidents; and Lieutenant Norman Prince, founder of the American Escadrille in France in World War I, and now hundreds of names and service records of World War II veterans.

Names and records of the living and deceased veterans of this area are being sought by the War Memorial Committee and enrollment forms may be obtained from Washington Cathedral, Mount Saint Alban, Washington, D. C.



# Fred Mignone Tells Of Jap War Trials

Fred Mignone, well known New Haven lawyer, was the guest speaker at last Thursday at the weekly meeting of the Rotary club at St. Vincent de Paul's church.

Mr. Mignone, introduced by program Chairman Charles Miller, told of some of his experiences in Japan recently where he took part in the prosecution of the Japanese war criminals including Tojo.
