## Air Force Announces Course in Jet Planes

The addition of a course in Jet Airplane and Engine Maintenance Training to the list of courses available through the Air Force Career Plan was announced today by the Commanding General of the Air Training Command.

Upon enlistment, applicants will first be stationed at Lackland Field, San Antonio, Texas. There, they will receive thirteen weeks training and Air Force indoctrination, following which they will be sent to Chanute Field, Illinois, for the Jet Airplane and Engine maintenance course of five months duration.

The Air Force Career Plan, an unprecedented move, permits qualified High School graduates to select the type of training they desire from Technical courses offered. Upon receiving a letter of acceptance from Air Training Command Headquarters, the applicant is assured entrance into the technical training of his choice. The Branford Recruiting Station has full particulars.

Many questions have been asked, since the passing of the Armed Services Verification Bill, about where to enlist for the United States Air Forces. This has been clarified by a recent directive changing the United States Army Recruiting Service to the United States Army and Air Force Recruiting service.

Any recruiting station of the War Department will enlist eligible young men between the ages of 17-34 for any branch of the army or the air forces.

## VETERAN NEWS

Veterans authorized by the Veterans Administration to receive treatment from physicians or dentists working with the VA on a fee basis and who are given prescriptions written for treatment of their specified service-connected disabilities may have them filled by pharmacies having contracts with the Connecticut Pharmaceutical Association, Harry T. Wood, manager of the Hartford Regional Office of the Veterans Administration, stated today.

Wood emphasized that although an eligible veteran will have access to any pharmacy of his choice which is under contract with the CPA, there are certain requirements which have to be met in order to have the prescription paid by the Government.

These requirements are: The fee basis physician or dentist must have written authority from the VA to treat the veteran for a specified service-connected disability. This authority also permits the physician or dentist to prescribe for the condition specified in his authorization.

The prescription must bear the date written and the name and address of the veteran. Above the physician's signature on the prescription must appear: "I am authorized to treat and prescribe for the above-named Veterans Administration patient."

The prescription must be filled within ten days from the date it was written. The veteran acknowledges receipt of the prescription by signing his name to the following statement on the prescription: "I acknowledge receipt of prescription Number—on (date)."
