LEGION NINE MEETS OLD TIMERS MONDAY

The Branford Legion team will swing back into action on Monday when it meets the Old Timers in the second of a series of games to establish a town champion.

The Old Timers took the measure of the Townies in a torrid contest last Friday night but Walt Brannigan and Joe Orsene feel that they have learned enough of the weaknesses of the veterans to give the Legion a clear cut advantage.

Furthermore, it was pointed out Addison Long has the fastest ball the Old Timers have seen since the days of Kinky Korman and that should mean a big difference.

There is a possibility that the crafty portlander Vin Casanova will get the call and Brannigan feels that his sharp curves will have the oldsters breaking their backs.

The Old Timers will be bolstered by the return of Dave Hylenski, veteran shortstop, who was out of the first tilt with a dislocated finger.

Bob Bradley will do the hurling for the Old Timers and Lou Locarno will go behind the plate. Stan Sokoloski will be on first with Bill Sadowski on second, Hylenski will be at short and Charlie Jones at third. Owens, Steve Hylenski and Pop Duet will be in the outer garden.

Two more games have been listed for the Legion against legion opponents. Next Thursday, Branford will go to Deep River to meet the champions of the Middlesex division and on the following Monday Deep River will come to Branford. Both games are slated to start at six sharp.

Townies Clip Easties 6 To 4 In Fast Game

In one of the best played games of the season at Hammer Field last Sunday afternoon, the Branford Townies outlasted a determined East Haven Reds combine to eke out a win over the McTrottes-Carr combination 6 to 4.

The game was played before the best paying crowd of the season. Branford counted first when Bob Lake tripled in the first frame and scored when Kenny Newton singled to right with two out.

Mel Bigelow, pitching for the locals, retired the side on strikes in the second although Tarbell and Walker reached third and second on a single and error. Baldino matched his effectiveness by striking out two and forcing the third man to pop to Thompson at first.

In the top half of the third East Haven went ahead.

Lake grounded into an infield out and Proto fanned to end the frame after Bradley, Bigelow and K. Marsh had singled to open the frame.

Dorie Walker and Buddy D'onorfrio dented the plate in the East Haven cause in the top of the fifth as hits by Albano and Carbone aided their advance.

Branford got its insurance run in the last of the seventh when Newton counted after reaching on a fielder's choice which erased Lake who had walked. Dave Marsh's second hit scored the right fielder from second base.

AIR-SICKNESS

Airsickness occurs in about one of every 200 air passengers. It is characterized by nausea, dizziness, or stomach distress. There seem to be many contributing factors. The person who is inclined toward nervous tension is a chief sufferer. Failure of certain parts of the body to adapt themselves to speed, rough motion, or high altitude also is involved.

The eyes, ears, and nervous system ordinarily cooperate to preserve body balance. But in some persons they react strangely to motion and this accounts for the stomach upsets that rack the victim. Some observers believe the trouble begins in the balancing mechanism of the inner ear.

The condition may be evident only when flying is rough, due to the rise and fall of the plane in turbulent air. But other factors are often psychic or emotional. Fear of falling from high places, fumes, odors, or poor ventilation and the low pressure of high altitudes, and the sight of others in distress may also bring on the condition.

Persons who board a plane with stomach empty are just as susceptible as persons who have eaten heavy meals. It has been recommended that a light meal be taken in preference to either extreme.

Fortunately, improvements in air travel have lessened the danger of rough trips. The new large planes have pressurized cabins and the air inside is kept at a pressure comparable to that at 8,000 feet altitude while the plane is flying at 20,000 feet or more.

Few persons need hesitate to travel by air because of physical disability. However, those with serious heart trouble, tuberculosis, anemia, sinusitis, or ear disorders should consult their physician before making an air trip. Depending on the individual, medication is now to be had through prescription will alleviate and frequently prevent airsickness.
