FINDING TUBERCULOSIS
Tuberculosis is responsible for nearly 50,000 deaths in the United States each year. It kills at the rate of one person every eleven minutes - kills nearly 1,000 American a week.

It is true that tuberculosis has been forced from first to seventh place among leading causes of death in this country since the organization of the National Tuberculosis Association in 1940. But despite the nationwide tuberculosis campaign and accelerated since the founding of the N.T.A. TB still holds the causes of death from diseases among young adults between 15 and 34.

One of the reasons why tuberculosis has been difficult to control is that the disease is a highly communicable one, spread easily from person to person. To complicate matters, tuberculosis has no outward symptoms in its early stage. Therefore, a person may have tuberculosis in an early stage and not even know that he is ill. He innocently goes about his daily tasks, spreading tuberculosis germs among his family, his friends, and his working associates.

There are an estimated 250,000 of these "unknown" or unreported cases of tuberculosis in this country. But we know how to find these unknown cases, and once they are found, measures can be taken to have them placed under treatment and thus halt the spread of the disease.

One way the unknown cases can be and are being found is by X-raying apparently healthy adults. For the X-ray can "see" evidence of the disease even in its earliest stages, before symptoms are apparent.

In communities all over the nation, the National Tuberculosis Association and its 3,000 affiliates are cooperating with official health agencies in conducting chest X-ray surveys to find these unknown cases. Fortunately, the majority of cases found in the surveys are in the early stages, when the disease is easiest to cure.

The case-finding work of the tuberculosis associations is supported solely by the annual sale of Christmas Seals as are the other year-round projects of the associations which include health educa-
