Use evergreen branches discarded after the holidays for added protection around rose bushes or spread them over builb plantings exposed to strong February sunlight to hold back premature growth.

Take advantage of mild winter days to prune grape vines and fruit trees but be sure temperature is above freezing to avoid injury when cutting.
