In an effort to strengthen the ordinance of the Building Code dealing with oil and oil burners, the Board of Selectmen this week authorized the enforcement of the law, which was established on October 20, 1933 but which has never been heeded, they said. Permits and licenses will be available by April 1st at the Building Inspector's Office £ d will take effect thirty days later. The ordinance applies to all sales, installations and servicing of oil burners in stoves, ranges and similar devices and the storage and similar devices and the storage and handling of fuel oil within the limits of the town. It specifically states that no person shall engage in the business of installing and servicing oil burners unless he shall have first obtained a license. Installations and servicing in must be under the immediate supervision of the owner of the illeense. Each license will expire on May I each year.
