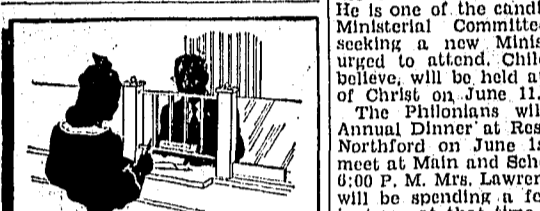

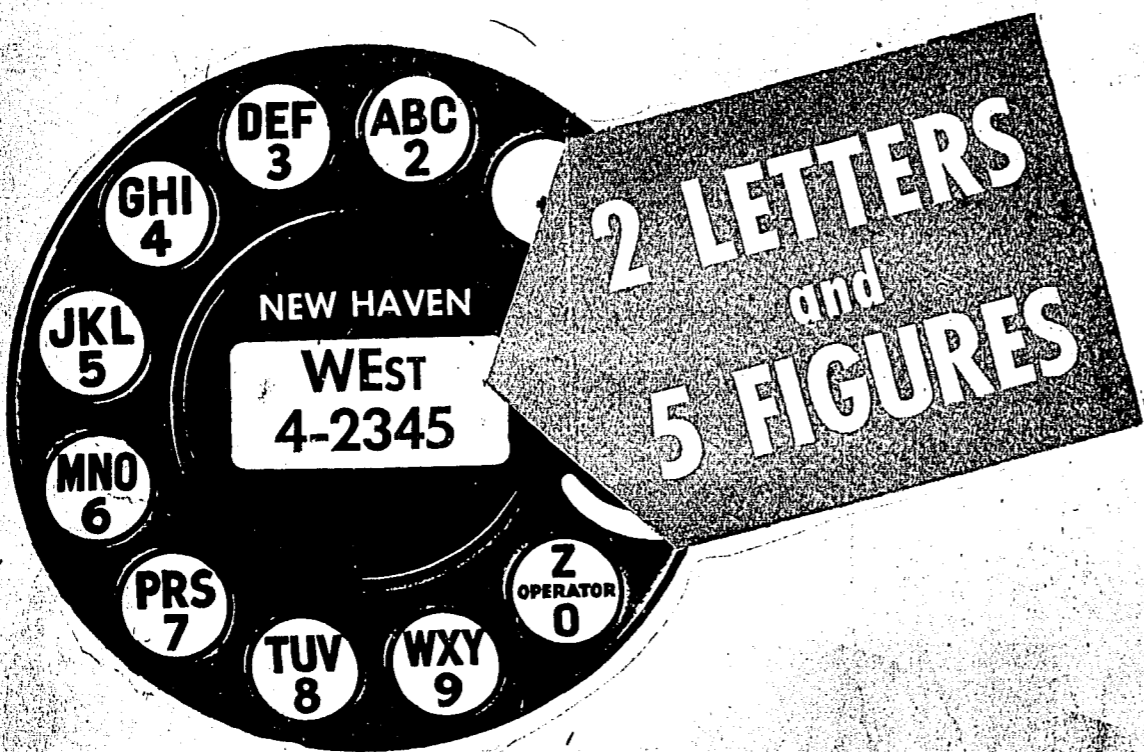

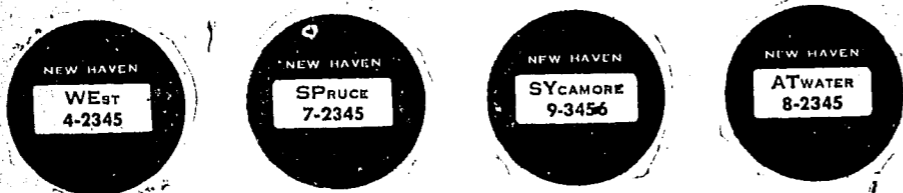

So before you dial any number in the New Haven area, after 7 o'clock Sunday morning, please check the number in your NEW telephone directory.



Here are samples of the 20,000 new numbers in the New Haven area. In your NEW telephone directory you will find the first two letters of the names in capitals. This is to remind you to dial only the first two letters before you dial the five figures. Of course, if the number you are dialing doesn't have a name, you just dial the five figures.

When You Dial NEW HAVEN Numbers from BRANFORD--

PLEASE REMEMBER THESE 3 THINGS

- 1. Know the Correct Number you are calling before you dial. That means looking for it in the NEW directory you will receive before June 4.
2. Dial "9" First, before you dial anything else.
3. If the New Haven Number you are calling has a name— dial the first two letters of the name and then the five figures. If there is no name just dial the five figures.
