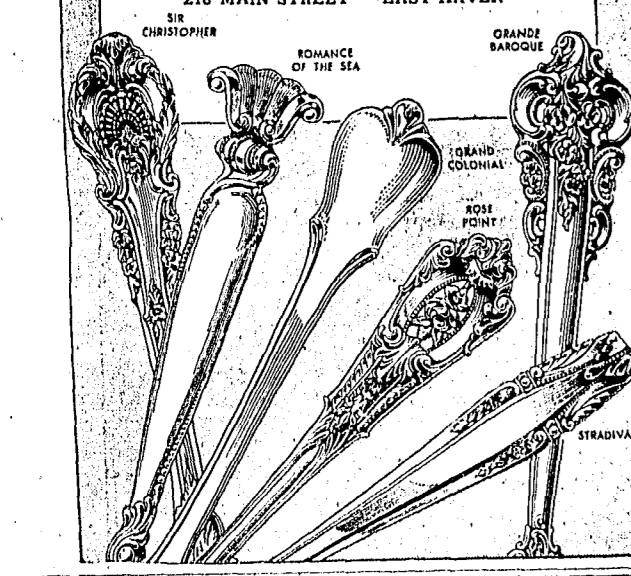

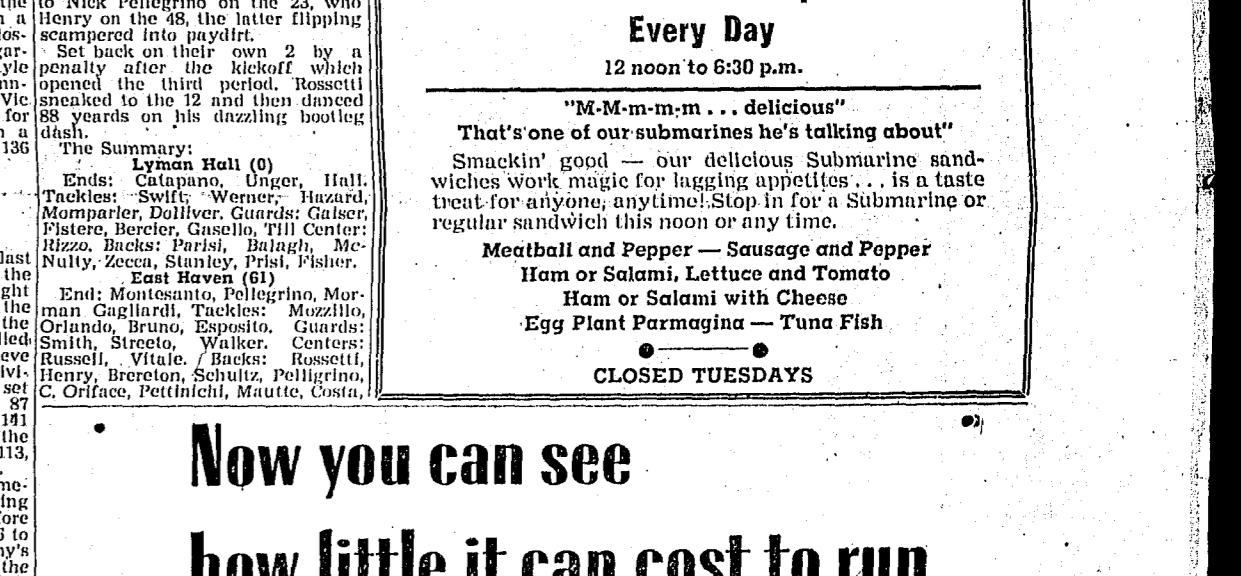

November 13th is the big day in Branford for Scouting. We will have five boys on stage to receive their Eagle Awards. Yep, they successfully passed the Board of Review and they wait only the official presentation. Now that brings up an issue that we are trying to settle. How many Eagle Scouts have there been in Branford? Are you an Eagle? Do you know an Eagle? Can you interest any Eagles in attending our Court of Honor? We are really trying hard to locate any local folks who have at anytime passed the requirements for Eagle. For those of you who may not know what is expected for this rank, I will at this time run it through briefly. First a boy must have a total of 21 Merit Badges, which shall include, Cooking, Camping, Civics, Birdstudy, Lifesaving, Pioneering, Physical Development, Pathfinding, Public and Personal Health, Swimming and First Aid. In Scouting Circles these are referred to as required Badges. Now, in addition, a boy can choose any others to make up the twenty one. Sometimes when you think this might be an easy accomplishment, take a Scout Handbook and check up on some of these badges and see the work that goes into a trip down the Eagle Trail. Along with the badges must go three letters of character reference from responsible folks who know the Scout and will say that they feel he is living up to the Scout Oath and Law. Rep. H. Seely-Brown Boosts County Gov't At Officials Dinner

A strong boost for the effectiveness of county government was given by Congressman Horace Seely-Brown, Jr., of the Second Connecticut district when he addressed the luncheon meeting of the Connecticut Association of County Officials at the Snake Meadow Club, Danielson (Oct. 24), according to Sen William Jaspers of East Haven, who was among the more than 60 County Officials attending the session. Jaspers reported today that Congressman Seely-Brown spoke vigorously of the need for maintaining strong government at home, where needs of the people, rather than "to the aid of a concentration of power," such as he said he "had had his fill of observing in Washington." County officials present at the meeting reported on the improvements in the operation of county government in some of the counties, the cost of county government on a basis of the ratio to the entire government cost, is continuing to decrease. Congressman Seely-Brown urged the County Officials to "resist with all the strength that you can command, the efforts that are being made to weaken and wipe out county government in this state and elsewhere." He asserted that "you some civic activities. Well I guess that is enough for the Eagle Scout Badge, for this time anyway. But if you know of any Eagles how about getting in touch with me so I can try and work them into our program?"

County Officials can do a better job with the responsibilities of government entrusted to you, than the bureaucrat, whether he sits at Hartford or at Washington." He asserted that he "knew the magnificent job is being done by the officials of Windham County," and that he had "watched closely and have been much impressed by the work in the other three counties that comprise my congressional district." County Commissioner Harry Schwartz of Norwich, vice-president of the Association, presided. It was announced that a nominating committee will present a slate of officers, for election at the next meeting on November 13. The county officials from all parts of the state were the guests of the Windham County members of the Association, including Sheriff Lionel Florer, Commissioners L. Allen Averill, Carl W. Jewett and Gerard J. Caron, County Treasurer Henry J. Marchessault, who recently became judge of the Plainfield Town Court, and County Sealer John Bennett.
