November Building Is Estimated At \$142,120.00 Figure

The estimated cost of building in East Haven during the month of November was set at \$142,120 by Building Inspector Clement Catalano today.

A total of \$781 was received by the department for various permits, licenses, and inspection fees during the month, Catalano reported.

Forty-two building permits for 20 dwellings were issued by the building department, bringing in \$325 in fees. Also issued during November were 65 electrical permits, costing a total of \$130. Thirteen plumbing permits at \$6 each and one \$4 plumbing permit, at a total cost of \$82, were reported by Catalano.

Other items included in the monthly report were: 24 oil burner permits, costing \$18; 42 power pump cleanout permits, totaling \$42; 13 septic tank permits, \$26; 11 street excavations, \$11; and one range oil storage permit, costing 50 cents.

Catalano reported that four licenses were issued to electrical contractors and one license to a plumbing contractor, costing \$25 and \$50 respectively. Five licenses at \$5 each were issued for the installation of oil burners.

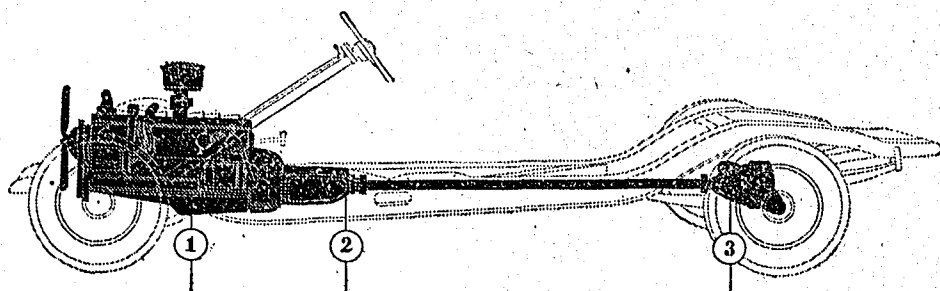

November Building Is Estimated At \$142,120.00 Figure

The estimated cost of building in East Haven during the month of November was set at \$142,120 by Building Inspector Clement Catalano today.

A total of \$781 was received by the department for various permits, licenses, and inspection fees during the month, Catalano reported.

Forty-two building permits for 20 dwellings were issued by the building department, bringing in \$325 in fees. Also issued during November were 65 electrical permits, costing a total of \$130. Thirteen plumbing permits at \$6 each and one \$4 plumbing permit, at a total cost of \$82, were reported by Catalano.

Other items included in the monthly report were: 24 oil burner permits, costing \$48; 42 power pump cleanout permits, totaling \$42; 13 septic tank permits, \$26; 11 street excavations, \$11; and one range oil storage permit, costing 50 cents.

Catalano reported that four licenses were issued to electrical contractors and one license to a plumbing contractor, costing \$25 and \$50 respectively. Five licenses at \$5 each were issued for the installation of oil burners.

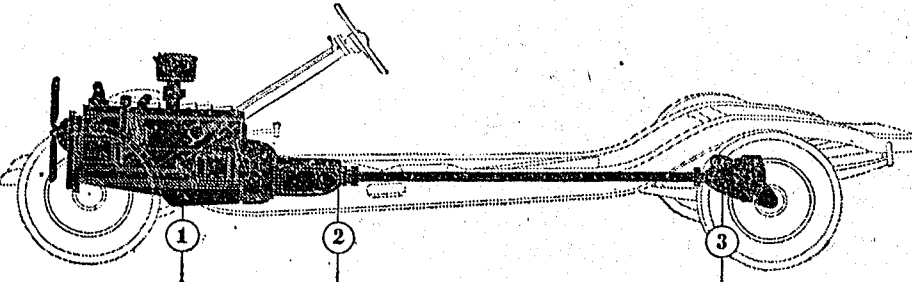
