Happy Birthday, Mr. Jacobs

Irving C. Jacobs, Jr., proprietor of the Branford Theatre and three-term State Representative celebrates his sixtieth birthday today.

Prominent in Connecticut Republican circles for two decades, Mr. Jacobs has been the friend and confidant of governors and other high public officials. During his terms in the State Legislature, 1941 through 1946, he was chairman of the Veterans' Affairs, Military Affairs and Civilian Defense committees of the House of Representatives. He was also a house member of the Committee on Public Information.

As chairman of the Veterans' Affairs committee he was often referred to as the "Daddy" of Connecticut's veterans' program, which

received wide acclaim and was used as a pattern by several states. Formerly president of the "Preferri Club" of the State Legislature, he continues to be active in its affairs and as toastmaster at its dinners, several of which are held each year. Mr. Jacobs was formerly Republican Town Chairman in Branford, a member of the Republican State Central Committee representing the 12th senatorial district and president of the Connecticut Motion Picture Theatre Owners Association.

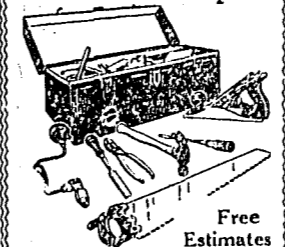

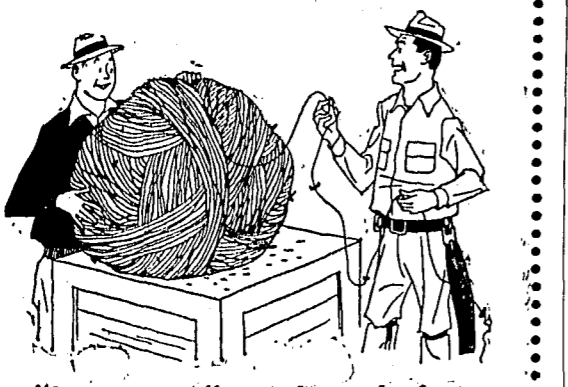

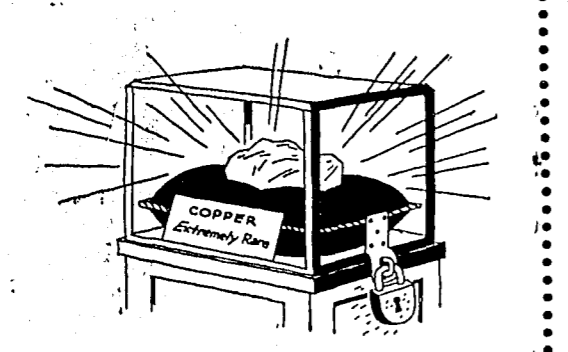
