expensive unless a strict policy based upon distance, traffic hazards and the age of pupils is "enforced without fear or favor."
Another recommendation was for the creation of the position of assistant superintendent... who would have training in the field of both education and business. Gillis implied that the assistant superintendent could assist both the superintendent and the secretary of the Board of Education.

Part of the superintendent's report is printed here:
Our greatest need is to face the facts and build a school plant sufficient to handle our needs. It is time to eliminate old and dilapidated and to expedite the building of the needed schools.

Our predecessors had difficulty in getting action and the annual reports include many warnings and pleas. In 1942 the elementary school evaluation report urged the "development of a long-time program for building." Pearson's survey report in 1943 pointed out the need, but his predictions were considered by many to be fantastic. Actually the same too conservative. Nothing was done. In succeeding reports warnings have been issued annually.

Now, in addition to the elementary school problem, we are faced with one in the high school. Next year we must remove the present grade pupils. In another year or so beyond that the eighth grade must go. After that, if we build on a four-year high school, that will also be necessary.

To postpone action on the matter of the high school will be to deprive our high school students of an adequate program. In the near future.

Some thought should be given to the seriousness of the situation by considering what the prospects are for next year. With no room in the high school for the seventh

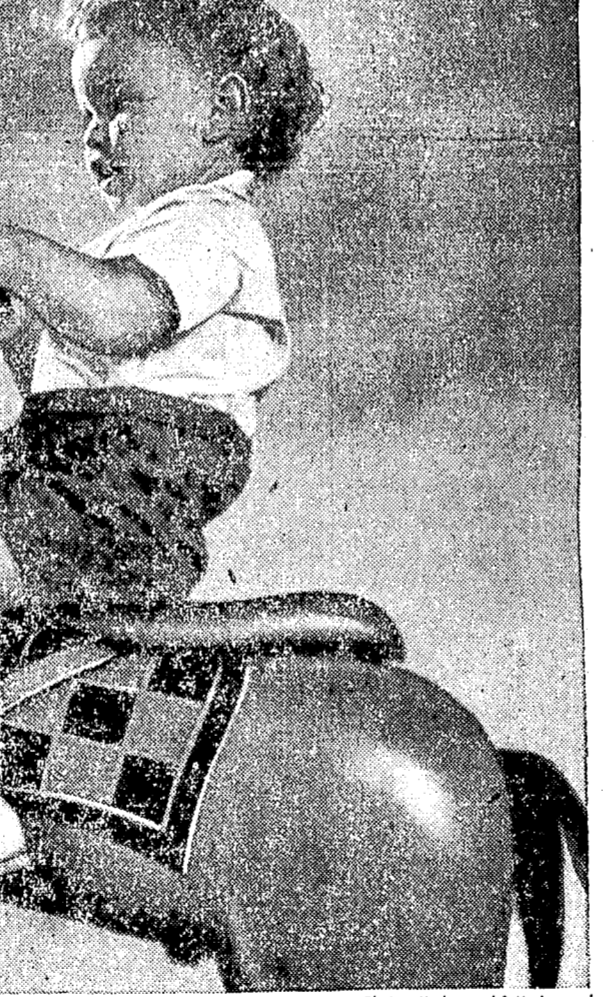

Charge Democrats Misrepresenting Facts On Erosion

Mrs. Elizabeth M. Crouney and Adolph C. Mautie said in a joint statement yesterday that if "Democratic misstatements and misrepresentations could be converted into jetties and breakwaters our beach protection problems would be solved." They said that "unfortunately the Democratic misrepresentations are so weak they won't stand up against a ripple of truth let alone a heavy sea."

The Republican candidates for the General Assembly answered a charge by the Democrats that they were bringing up a question which was listed in the Democratic town platform in 1941.

"The Republicans said it is 'indeed strange' that the Democrats suddenly remember the 1941 platform now after the Democrats were in control of the town from October 1, 1949 to September 30, 1951, and did nothing about it. Had the Democrats been sincere in their interest in beach erosion, they claimed, they had two long years to act but didn't."

"The erosion plank of 1941," Mrs. Crouney and Mautie said, "was washed out on the next tide after its adoption and that was the last that was ever heard of it until we revived the question of erosion."

The candidates said that as far as they could ascertain, the Federal government has never approved a beach erosion program under the redevelopment division of the Housing Administration. While the East Haven Redevelopment Commission is now engaged in a survey toward this objective, Washington has not given any assurance that it will make funds available for any phase of the work.
