Contract For Redecorating Gerrish School Awarded
Award of a painting and redecorating contract for the Gerrish School to the lowest bidder of three bids was made by the Board of Education Friday after a prolonged debate between members.
The Tremco Company which maintains a branch office in Bridgeport, was awarded the contract on the basis of its low bid of \$200,000 for labor and materials. Next lowest bidder was Anthony Esposito, \$3,000; and high bidder was George E. McManus, \$4,700.
Announcement of the bids by the school building committee, brought a motion from George Letts that the committee make a study of the schools for the purpose of drawing up specifications to be sent to the contractors for a new bid.
Left argued, as at a previous session, that by awarding the contract to submit their own specifications the committee did not permit contractors to bid against the others. He had submitted by McManus provided for the installation of rock wall ceiling in the boys' and girls' toilet rooms.

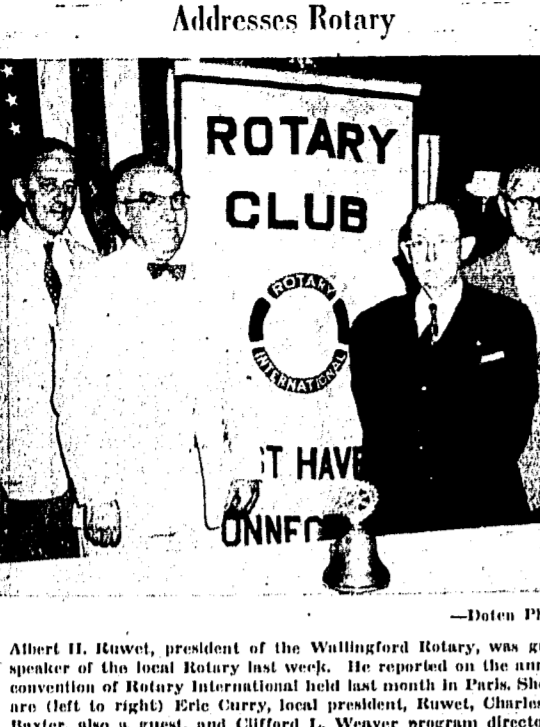

Library Given Reference Material On Disabled Vets

The Hagaman Memorial Library has added to its permanent files a study unit prepared by the Disabled American Veterans to provide reference material on the disabled veteran and his problems.

Prepared by the DAV to develop in all Americans an understanding of the continuing obligation of our democracy to the handicapped veteran," the study unit gives reference purposes; types of war disabled veterans; history of disabled veterans; the disabled veteran in a democratic society; rehabilitation of the disabled veteran; and disabled veteran legislation.

Public libraries throughout the nation are now making the unit a part of their reference collections. A recent survey shows that one out of every 10 living Americans who fought in this nation's wars, including Korea, has been wounded, injured or disabled as a result of military service, according to the DAV. There are approximately 20 million living ex-servicemen in the United States today and more than 10 per cent of this number—2,357,689 as of a recent date—are recognized as disabled by the Veterans Administration.

The DAV reports that 29 million Americans have served in the armed forces of this nation since the Revolution and including Korea. More than 955,000 have lost their lives. In addition to the number of disabled veterans, there are 440,647 widows of veterans and 305,982 dependent children.

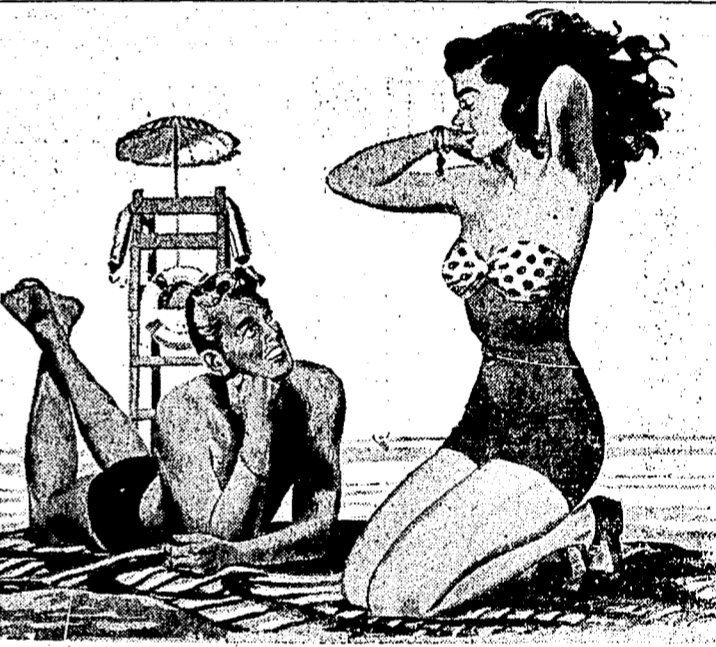
