

County Farm News

On one county farm visited was found pullets starting to lay that were vaccinated for Newcastle a short time ago. The dark eggs, shell color quickly turned to chalk white and production took a tumble. They will likely come back quickly, but the vaccination job should have been done earlier. Recommended Newcastle disease vaccination program for egg producing flocks is day old vaccination in the eye or nostril, followed by wing-web vaccination from 12 to 16 weeks of age. Recommended bronchitis immunization on an experimental basis is from 6 to 12 weeks of age. Applications for enrollment in the bronchitis program are available at the County Agents office.

These agents, Pittsfield: Ernest Kupferschmid, Ellington; and Fred Segala, Canaan, were selected as winners in the 1953 Connecticut Greener Pasture Contest. The winners will compete in the New England Greener Pasture Contest to select the top pasture producer in New England. Trophies will be awarded to the winner by Charles Larson, Third, President of the Connecticut Greener Pasture Club at the Connecticut Forage Day at the University of Connecticut.

It could be a long time before profits from eggs will be better than during the present summer of 1953. Will egg and poultrymen will do well to take full advantage of the situation. Extra attention will pay off in a higher rate of increased food consumption and good behavior. It will pay to site the house, walk through the house, keep the water clean and fresh and ventilate properly. Culling should be continued during August and September, look out for cannibalism and egg eating. Shells are thin, and careful handling saves cracks and losses. Gather eggs at least 5 times a day. This will greatly increase the percentage of clean, sound shelled, top quality eggs. Don't let opportunity knock at the door and not take advantage of it.

Flies are very numerous and troublesome on poultry farms this summer. A farm that has a fly and other problem is headed for trouble. Farm sanitation and clean-up of all possible breeding sites is still the basis for fly control. The use of pyrethrum-containing space sprays, foggers or aerosols will help with the job.

Flies become extremely resistant to D.D.T. It is exterminated. Turkey men should clean-up under turkey manure as well as the use of sprays. Get the latest in control methods from the Extension Service.

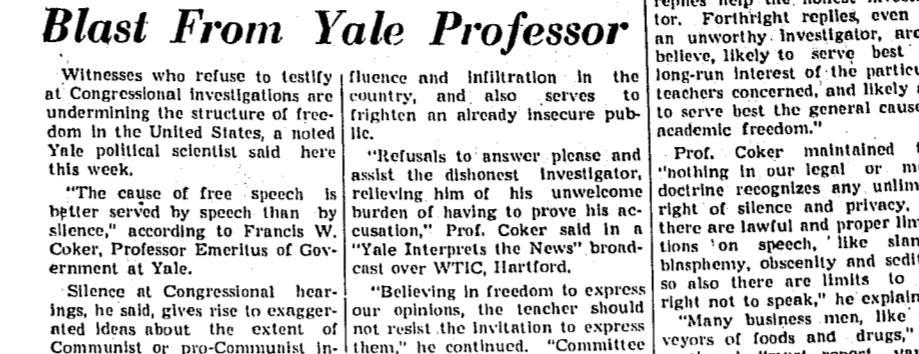

**New England GOP

Eisenhower Shines**

President Eisenhower will deliver a major address at an All-New England dinner reception to be held in Boston Sept. 21.

The subjects President Eisenhower will discuss have not been revealed, but the executive committee in charge of the affair, meeting Wednesday night in Boston, announced it has been assured by the White House that the speech will be of major proportion.

The dinner, which is the first All-New England reception ever given to a president of the United States, is being arranged by Republican State and Finance Committees in all six New England states.

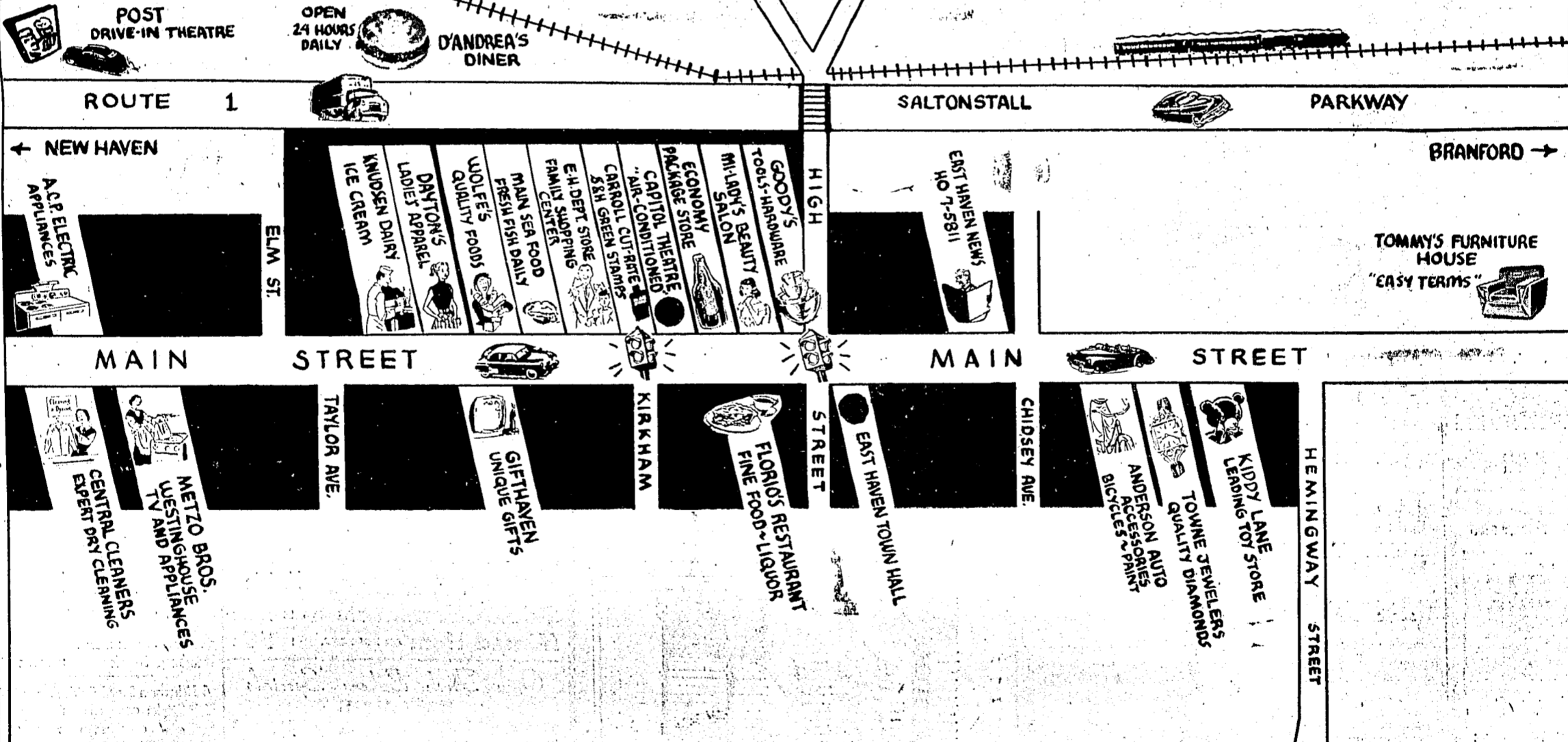
Republican State Chairman Clarence F. Baldwin and Republi-

can National Committeeman Meade Alcorn represented Connecticut at the Wednesday night session.

Admission to the dinner, marking President Eisenhower's first appearance in Southern New England since last November, will be by invitation to New Englanders who donate \$100 to their respective Republican State Finance Committees. More than a thousand persons have already qualified for dinner seats in the Garden, capacity of which for the dinner will be 5,000 persons.

Thomas W. Russell, chairman of the Connecticut Republican Finance Committee, estimates that some 200 persons from Connecticut will attend the affair.

Governor Lodge and four other New England Governors, Connecticut's Republican Senators and Congressmen as well as those from other states, Ambassador Lodge and other dignitaries will be invited to sit at the head table with the President.
