Six Attending Fire Fighting School In City

Six members of the East Haven Fire Department are scheduled tomorrow to complete a week-long course in fire fighting conducted by the state in cooperation with Fire Chief Paul Heinz of the New Haven department.

Fire Chief Thomas J. Hayes released a list of the names of the men who are attending the day-time intensive training being given at the State Firemen's Training School under New Haven Battalion Chief Andrew Flanagan.

The men, all of the rank of fireman, are: Walter Wylie, Edward Buechele, Elmer Brainard, Daniel Carroll, Charles Fallon and John Covert. In addition to going to school days, each has put in two nights of work in the local department to keep the personnel strength at a safe level.

Two volunteers, Frank Andres of Company one and William Jackson of Company six were put on duty as substitute firemen in the absence of the trainees.

In the course of training the men have received instruction in the laying of hose line and the use of regular water and fog hoses. They have been taught techniques in fighting tank car fire and oil fires and have received training in the use of gas masks under actual conditions of heat and smoke inside a building.

The course began Monday.

Woman Loses Bid To Head Bartlett Post In Close Vote

Mrs. Alice Cameron, a candidate for the post of Junior vice commander, lost her bid for the position. She had put her name in line for being the first woman commander of the local Legion post by a close vote.

Mrs. Cameron, adjutant to the Harry Bartlett post, was nosed out by a single vote. It was reported unofficially, receiving 44 to the 45 votes gained by her successful opponent, Frank Mozoulous. The election took place at the annual meeting of the post last Thursday.

GOP Fight Averted As McManus Pledges His Support To Ticket

Threat of a primary contest in the Republican Party diminished Friday with a unanimous town committee vote in favor of an organization slate headed by First Selectman Frank Barker and Second Selectman Ernest Anthonis disappeared altogether Monday night when no rival slate was filed. Deadline for filing was midnight Monday.

In announcing that there would be no primary fight, Town Chairman Matthew Anastasio declared that the Republican Party was now unified and that he believed it would present "a united front in the coming election campaign." Failure of the primary fight to develop, he said, was proof that "all was harmonious" in Republican ranks.

Releases Letter
The chairman released a letter signed by George McManus and stating that he did not wish to have a primary contest and that he was joined in this by Anthony Ferriola, reported to be interested in the companion nomination for selectman.

The letter in part, dated Sept. 1, reads as follows:
Dear Matty:
Reference is made, etc.
My purpose in writing to you some time ago requesting consideration of an alternative set of candidates for the positions of First and Second Selectmen was in the hope that the strongest possible slate be presented to the voters in October. Foxon Park Assoc. Considers Revised Bus Line Schedule

A revised schedule of operations with the restoration of some of the service recently curtailed was submitted by the Shore Line Bus Company at a meeting of the Foxon Park Civic Association Wednesday evening.

The scheduled was the outcome of a meeting Tuesday between a committee representing the association and M. A. Savin, president, and Stanley W. Breck, general manager of the Shore Line Company. If approved by the association, the schedule will come upon approval by the Public Utilities Commission.

Breck told the group that at present the company was operating the New Haven - North Branford route at a loss. He said the company could only provide as much service as the patronage on the buses would warrant.

Last night's meeting of the Foxon Park group was the first regular fall meeting since the monthly meetings were suspended last spring. The association has been meeting in special session on local matters such as bus service and the adoption of a garbage-disposal ordinance.

Town Properties On Block Sold To Tinari, N. H. Woman

Sale of a portion of the town's old dump on Hemingway Ave. to Nicholas Tinari, town assessor, at a price of \$1,000 was revealed this week by First Selectman Frank Barker.

The plot fronting approximately 210 feet on Hemingway Ave. by approximately 430 feet deep was sold on July 17 and recorded in the Town Hall on Aug. 18. The property was included in a list of town-owned lots advertised for sale last fall, Barker said.

Other town property fronting 100 feet on Moulthrop St. and 110 feet deep was sold to Josephine Fusco of New Haven at a price of \$500 according to revenue stamps affixed to a deed filed Aug. 19.

Superintendent Releases School Bus Schedule

With the opening of school just a few days away, the office of superintendent of schools this week released a schedule for school buses transporting children to and from school.

Supt. R. Vernon Rays said that the reassignment of grade seven pupils to schools other than the high school has made necessary many bus schedule changes. He stated that "it is hoped that parents will recognize this factor during the first few days of school while school officials are working with the Chicago Bus Company to provide the best possible routes."

The bus schedule follows showing the time of the pick-up of students at their home in the morning and the time the bus leaves the school on the return trip.

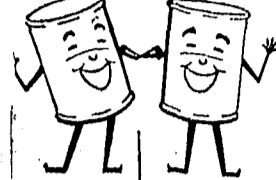

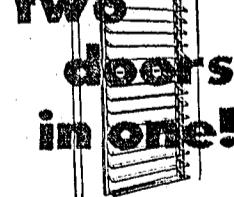

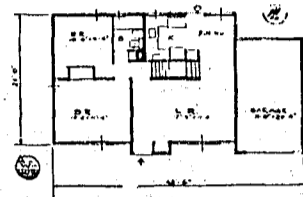
