Says Press Ought Not To Become **Town** Arbitrator

Members of the local press should not set themselves up as arbitratorsin the lown govern ment, Mathew Anastasio. man of the Republican town committee, declared Monday night.

In remarks plainly, aimed 'at East Haven reporters who have been pressing both parties for official declarations on press v cov rage of town governmental bodles, Anastasio reaffirmed hi stand that the press should be allowed only into "open hearings" in which representatives of the public are expressing their views. Speaking before a gathering of about 40 persons attending a Republican open house in the Wes End Bowling Alleys building, An astasio also charged that local Democrats were being dishonest about their statements regarding press access to meetings. He said that they have failed to guaranthe press entry to executive sea sions. (Editor's note: the East Haven News has not requested admission to executive sessions properly held.)


Anastasio implied that members of the press were attempting to arbitrate the actions of local governmental bodies, although he p1P_ not make clear just how this would be done. While expressing the general fears of some officials regarding the manner in which reporters would seek to "cover" meetings, Anastasio's cenarks sometimes took on the semblance of a flailing of a straw man since there appeared to be no instances of reporters participating in board meetings or demanding entry into executive sessions,

In his attack on the Democrats the GOP leader stated: "they (Democrats) are saying the same thing that I am only they're not honest about it." "I still stand on ny remarks that the press should be allowed to all open hearings to get the facts. But only those people who are elected or appoint-ed are to make the decisions." "If alter the press hears the "pros" and "cons", they algo no satisfied," "Anastasio said, "they arc entitied to write an editorial. I don't believe that the press or Mr. Czar (editor of the East Havch News) as a newspaperman can set himself up as the deciding factor as to what's right or wrong

in this town." "I said all boards should hav press releases," he continued, "and I maintain it should be dene, but Democrats Answer Lawler any man who hasn't been elected or appointed should listen. If he doesn't agree with the decision then he can write an editorial."
