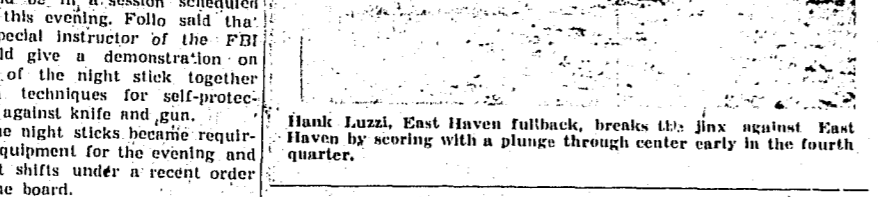

The deadline for poster entries for the annual Exchange Club Fire Prevention Week poster and essay contest is Friday, Sept. 18.

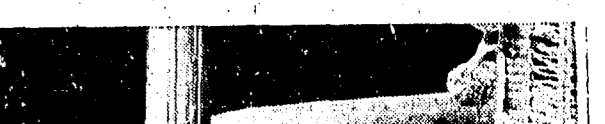

Knights Defeat Green Eastie Team 32-13

Luzzi And Gustafson Score For East Haven

Despite advantages in weight and experience, the Blue Knights of Southington High had to take to the air last Saturday afternoon to inflict a 32-13 defeat on a smaller East Haven team. The game, an opener for both clubs, was played on the High School field here before more than 1,000 fans.

Using its traditional single-wing offense, the Southington team found its ground plays slowed by a stout defense put up by the Easties who fought valiantly under Co-captains Hank Luzzi and Leonard "Butch" Orifice.

But breaks accounted for at least two of the Southington scores, after East Haven managed to hold the visitors to a scoreless first quarter. Joining Luzzi and Orifice in stopping the breaches was Jogi Gustafson, tall East Haven end, who left an outstanding defensive role, to match a short pass from Ralph Streeto on the Southington 30-yard line and churn his way around the rival team's right end for a touchdown.

The Easties' other score was by Luzzi who butted his way through the center from the one yard line.

Thorpe's Deadly Arm

It was the deadly arm of Southington's Ray Thorpe that accounted, in the main, for the heavy defeat of the home team. The 175 pound fullback, tossing alternately to several receivers, completed eight out of 11 passes - two of them in scoring plays - to roll up 112 yards for the Knights.

The picture looked even worse when East Haven fumbled the kickoff on its own 24 and Southington took over. In the very next play, Thorpe shot a flat pass into the hands of Clements who raced around the Eastie left end for a third tally. This time Andy Meade's conversion was good.

East luck set heavily on the down-hearted East Haven team. Luzzi took the kick-off on his own 20 and ran it up to the 35. But East Haven inexperience showed up again. Ralph "Yogi" Streeto stepped back for a pass, couldn't find a receiver and was smeared on the 22. Luzzi ran the ball to the 20.

On the next play, Streeto again found himself hemmed in on the 15 and in a gamble threw the ball in an underhand pass to Art Conello, right halfback. Conello was looking forward and didn't see the pass; and Walt Zakrewski, Southington end, snapped up the ball for a surprise interception running it over for a fourth tally. Meade's kick was good.

DeCaprio Breaks Jinx

East Haven bobbed the kickoff again taking over on its own five yard line. Then Streeto started a passing attack which moved East Haven up to the 41, but in the next play East Haven was forced to kick. Thorpe took the ball to the 32 but a penalty brought it back to the 17. Three plays later Clements fumbled a catch from Thorpe and DeCaprio broke the East Haven jinx by recovering on the Southington 30.

A clipping penalty slowed the East Haven advance but was

neutralized by a similar penalty against Southington. Luzzi and Streeto took over to run the ball in plays alternating with passes by Streeto which, despite a 15 yard penalty, got the ball to the one yard line. Luzzi rammed it over the center for the first Eastie touchdown. His kick attempt was blocked.

Southington returned with a new drive which saw Thorpe carrying the ball in steady drives from the Southington 46. In a final play Thorpe took the ball over from the 13. Meade's kick was no good.

Tuition By Surprise

With a few minutes to go, East Haven took the Knights by surprise in its old Statue of Liberty play. Streeto handed the ball to Conello deep in Eastie territory. Then Streeto opened a series of passes to Luzzi and Gustafson. The latter grabbed a short pass on the Southington 39 and zipped down the left end of the field showing off several threatening Knights to score again. Luzzi's kick was good. In two more plays the game was over.

Shining in the defensive honors were Joe Malillo and Bill Ginnelli who joined Orifice in plugging gaps in the line to slow the Southington ground drive.

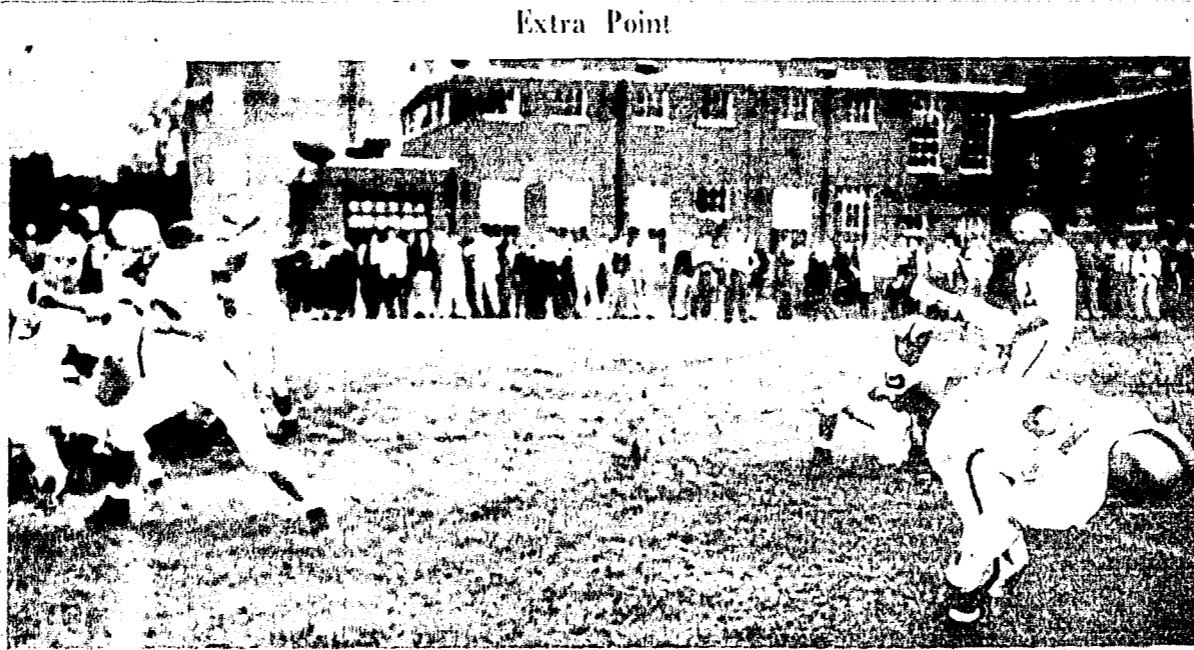
