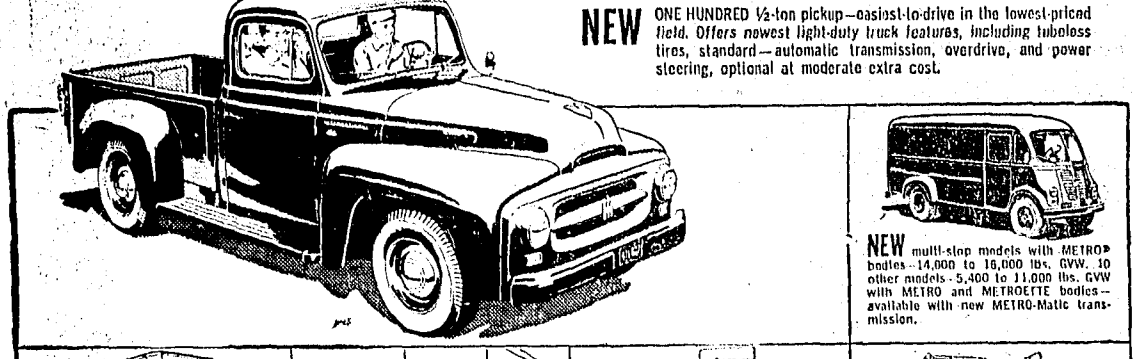

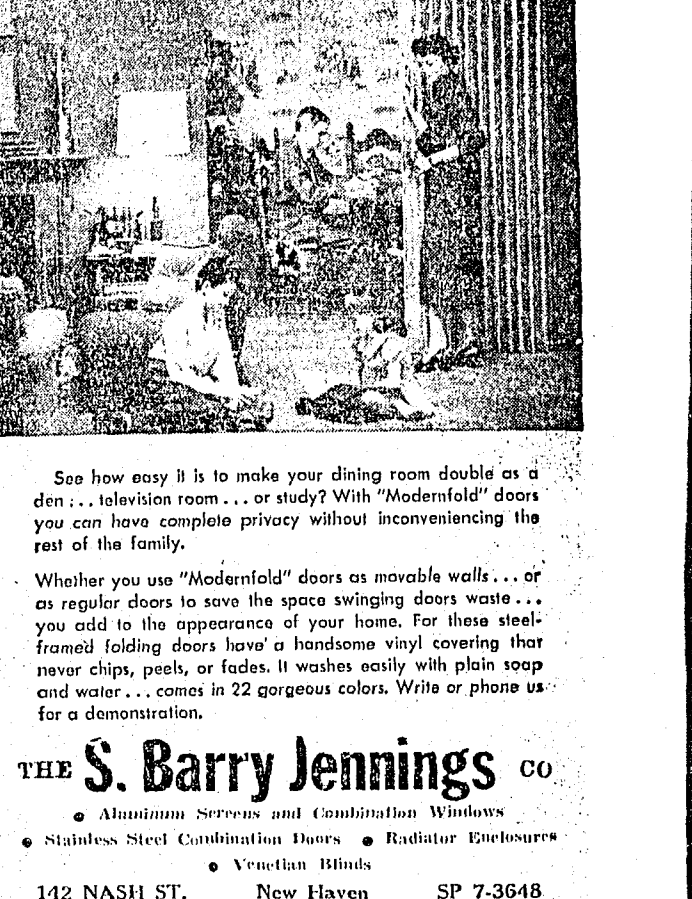

Garden Notes - (Continued From Page Five) removing only the younger, outer portions for replanting. Discard the hard, woody centers as they have no value. Before replanting, enrich the soil liberally with an all-purpose fertilizer and humus which may be broadcast over the surface before turning over the soil. Such treatment will revitalize the earth and encourage strong growth. Reset the divisions firmly, allowing space for future growth and water thoroughly. This would be a good time to include several new varieties such as coral bells, doricolum, bleeding heart, summer phlox or peonies to add new interest to the planting scheme.



WHAT WE EAT Good nutrition requires that the diet contain certain products essential to health, such as protein, mineral elements, vitamins, sufficient calories to supply energy needs and water. The protective foods are recognized as meat, milk, eggs, leafy vegetables, fruits and whole grain or enriched bread and cereals. A person is assured that nutritional requirements are being met by eating these protective foods. Other foods may be added to the diet as the individual prefers, but overeating should be guarded against. It is the principal cause of overweight. Diet is linked with health and the control of such conditions as diabetes and liver injury through proper nutrition are indicative of this fact. Certainly, nutrition has played a major role in prenatal care, in the healthy development of children and in maintaining the health of the aged. But still many persons do not devote sufficient thought to the real meaning of nutrition and its relation to health and growth. However, advances in health education in recent years have greatly increased the number of persons who recognize this close relationship. Also, a growing amount of scientific research is being directed toward nutritional standards. There is every evidence that this trend will continue and that the years ahead will witness increased improvement in eating habits.
