It doesn't necesarily follow because your "sitter" worked out all right when pressed into service on the occasional night-out when all she may have had to do was sit while Johnny slept, that she wil be equally good with him in the woods or at the beach, This may be too great a test of her interest in young children, her adaptability, patience and un-derstanding and ability to play well with the youngsters.

needs to be mature and dependable enough to understand her duties to the child and accept her responsibility to follow his every move. Even momentary relaxation of watchfulness at the beach can be disasterous. You know girls will be girls, and distractions offered by others their own age tend to take their minds off child-sitting jobs.

So, don't entrust your pre-school child to a sitter for the first time for out-door jaunts without having seen her in action with children and remembe that she cannot be responsible for a number of children, esnicially if they are unrelated. Two or three children at the most is all she can be expected to care for. Parental permission for beach groups made up of a number of unrelated children with one or several young sitters and no responsible adults around is not only unwise but can be dis-

asterous.

Our advice to mothers is to stay close by when their pre-school children are near the shore, even when a baby sitter ls also in attendance. Let's make a record for child safety on Connecticut shores this sum-


