#### Five Local Boys Aid In Rescue Of 70 Flood Victims Playground Kids Give Pienie Fund; Civic Assn. Contribute

A week ago tonight disaster struck in the Naugatuck Valley. mere 2 hours later more than or residents of Waterbury, Naugatuck, Ansonia and Derby were dead; victims of one of the greatest floods ever to sweep this

A week ago tonight, East Haven was a town divided into three political camps. Republicans, Democrats and the supporters of Clinney and his loyal 15.

Today, politics are forgotten as the members of this communborne by their fellowmen throughout the disaster area.

No sooner had the claxon sounded that help was badly needed in the stricken area, then East Haven began to send aid. Men, women and children pitched in to save the life and proper-

On Friday afternoon, when it was evident that the tragedy in the Valley was continuing unabated, and the threat of still rising waters haunted the rest of the state, five local boys, rang-ing in age from 17 to 18, proved that all are not delinquent teen-agers. That civic responsibility is not restricted to the grey-

The five boys, Charles Barr-The five boys, Charles Berry mann 17, of 58 Kimberly Avenue; Calvin, Ohidy 17, of 5 Mendow Street, Dickie Carlson 18, of Mendow Street, Robert Wardele 17, of Tyler Street, and John Schwartz 17, of Mendow Street, loaded three boats they obtained from Talmadge Boat Yards and Woods Boat Dock, onto a flat hed truck donated by the New Haven Pulp and Board and took off for the flood zone.


