Strategic Systems Improvement

Goal/Objective 1: Goal 1: Renovate and Repair the Library Building

• Objective 1: Based upon Landmark Architect's Roof Assessment Report in May of 2018 funding the replacement of the deteriorating flat roofing areas to the library building with code compliant flat roof areas and repairing the slate tile roof.

Goal/Objective 2: <u>Upgrade the Library's internal connections and Public Wi-Fi Network.</u>

• Objective 2.1: Apply for Category 2 E-rate funding in the 2020 application cycle (funding for FY 2020-2021) to upgrade internal connections and the Public Wi-Fi Network.

Goal/Objective 3: <u>Make the Library Building's Elevator American with Disabilities Act (ADA) Compliant.</u>

• Objective 3.1: Funding, based upon ADA elevator feasibility study completed in the spring of 2018 by Landmark Architects (Middletown, CT) that provided recommendations, specifications, and costs for an American with Disabilities (ADA) compliant and self-service elevator.

Goal/Objectives 1: Retain and remunerate qualified library staffing.

• Objective 1.1: Set the pathway for the future transition to new management and leadership at the Library.

Goal /Objectives 2: To develop and sustain fundraising initiatives.
