Why is the American Flag Folded 13 Times?

Here is the meaning of each of those folds and what it means to you:

The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The second fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.

The third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veterans departing our ranks who gave a portion of their lives for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world

The forth fold represents our weaker nature, for as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace as well as in times of war for His divining guidance.

The fifth fold is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our Country, in dealing with other countries may she always be right; but it is still our country right or wrong."

The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States Of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, One Nation under God, Indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.

The seventh fold is a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that we protect our country and our flag against all her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The eighth fold is a tribute to the One who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

The ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood; for it has been through their faith, their love, loyalty and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great has been molded.

The tenth fold is a tribute to the father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since they were first born.

The eleventh fold in the eyes of a Hebrew citizen represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies in the Hebrews' eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

The twelfth fold in the eyes of of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit.

The thirteenth fold completes the folded flag and the stars are uppermost reminding us of our nation's motto, "In God We Trust." After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under General George Washington, and the sailors and marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones, who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States, preserving for us the rights, privileges and freedoms we enjoy today.

There are some traditions and ways of doing things which have deep meaning.


We welcome new members- John P. Bonner, (3rd Armored Division) and James Medcalf, (Army Air Transport Command).



There are veterans in the Group who fought in France between June 6th, 1944 and May 8th, 1945, and are eligible to receive the beautiful French Legion of Honor Medal. Ken Delaney showed us his French Legion of Honor medal at the last meeting.

Here is what you need to do to applysend copies only:

- 1. Honorable discharge (DD-214) both sides
- 2. Brief history of your division or unit's service
- 3. Brief personal history of your serviceyour function and activities. It is important to include any medals or citations you received. Include your address, phone and any other contact information.





Honor Flight— Morse noted that many WWII veterans were, by that time, in poor health or did not have the means to travel. He took his cause to a local air club. Honor Flight now uses Boeing jets from 86 hubs in 33 states to fly WWII veterans to D.C. (from CNN "Taking World War II Veterans to See Memorial Before Time Runs Out" Alicia Eakin, Nov. 11th, 2009)

I spoke with the Lt. Governor's office concerning the next Honor Flight. A group went out this month and the next date has not yet been established. But it would be great to have some people from the Group on the next flight!

Military Museum to open in West Haven— Veteran, Frank Carrano have worked to find a home for an extensive array of military items formerly housed in New Haven at the 102nd Infantry Regiment Museum. Carrano was curator when that museum was open. The new museum will open in a warehouse on Hood Avenue in West Haven.

The space will feature collections from the 102nd Infantry Regiment Museum and the New Haven Grays, a protective force formed after the War of 1812. But it is hoped that pieces will be added to the museum over the years, including memorabilia donated or loaned by local families of war veterans. (from the *New Haven Register* "W.
